

Jane Goodall

Primatologist



- Jane Goodall was born in London, England in 1934.
- She was a British ethologist, known for her exceptionally detailed and long-term research on the chimpanzees of Gombe Stream National Park in Tanzania.
- Jane Goodall had an interest in animal behavior from an early age.
- She worked as a secretary and as a film production assistant until she gained passage to Africa.
- Once in Africa, she began assisting paleontologist and anthropologist Louis Leakey.
- Her association with Louis Leakey eventually led her to establish the camp in Gombe Stream Game Reserve in 1960, which is now a national park. She used this camp so she could observe the behavior of chimpanzees in the region.
- In 1965, the University of Cambridge awarded Jane Goodall a Ph.D. in ethology. She was one of very few candidates to receive a Ph.D. without first having possessed an A.B. degree.
- Except for short periods of absence, she and her family remained in Gombe until 1975.
- She often directed the field work of other doctoral candidates.
- In 1977, Jane Goodall cofounded the Jane Goodall Institute for Wildlife Research, Education and Conservation in California. It is commonly called the Jane Goodall Institute. Later, the center moved its headquarters to the Washington D.C. area.
- She also created various other initiatives, including a youth service program called Jane Goodall's Roots & Shoots.
- Over the years she was able to correct a number of misunderstandings about chimpanzees. She found that the animals are omnivorous, not vegetarian. That they are capable of making and using tools and that they have highly developed social behaviors.

Jane Goodall Quotes

- What you do makes a difference, and you have to decide what kind of difference you want to make.
- Each one of us matters, has a role to play, and makes a difference. Each one of us must take responsibility for our own lives, and above all, show respect and love for living things around us, especially each other.
- Change happens by listening and then starting a dialogue with the people who are doing something you don't believe is right.
- People said, "Jane, forget about this nonsense with Africa. Dream about things you can achieve."
- Only if we understand, can we care. Only if we care, we will help. Only if we help, we shall be saved.
- You cannot get through a single day without having an impact on the world around you. What you do makes a difference, and you have to decide what kind of difference you want to make.
- We have the choice to use the gift of our life to make the world a better place--or not to bother.
 - The least I can do is speak out for those who cannot speak for themselves.
- There is a powerful force unleashed when young people resolve to make a change.
- That is our hope. Because if we all start listening and helping, then surely, together, we can make the world a better place for all living things. Can't we?
 - We have so far to go to realize our human potential for compassion, altruism, and love.
 - Without patience I could never have succeeded.
- We still have a long way to go. But we are moving in the right direction. If only we can overcome cruelty, to human and animal, with love and compassion we shall stand at the threshold of a new era in human moral and spiritual evolution--and realize, at last, our most unique quality: humanity.
