- Rosa Parks was a civil rights activist who refused to surrender her seat to a white passenger on a segregated bus in Montgomery, Alabama.

- Rosa Parks defiance when she would not give up her seat to a white passenger sparked the Montgomery Bus Boycott.

- The success of the Montgomery Bus Boycott launched a nationwide effort to end racial segregation of public facilities.

- Rosa Parks received many awards during her lifetime as a leader of the civil rights movement, including the NAACP's highest award.

 Rosa Parks was born Rosa Louise McCauley on February 14, 1913 in Tuskegee, Alabama.

 Both of Rosa Parks' grandparents were former slaves and strong advocates for racial equality.

- On December 1, 1955, after a long day's work as a seamstress, Rosa Parks boarded a bus for home. She took a seat in the first row of several rows designated for "colored" passengers.

- The City Code required that all public transportation be segregated and that bus drivers had the "powers of a police officer of the city while in actual charge of any bus for the purposes of carrying out the provisions" of the code.
 - The bus drivers assigned seats by placing a line in the middle of the bus separating white passengers in the front of the bus and African-American passengers in the back.
- When an African-American passenger boarded the bus, they had to get on at the front to pay their fare and then get off and re-board the bus at the back door.
- Eventually, the bus was full and the driver noticed several white passengers were standing in the aisle. The driver asked Rosa Parks and 3 other passengers to give up their seats. Rosa Parks refused and remained seated.
 The bus driver had her arrested.
