Wetlands Water Play Sensory Bin:



- Container
- Water
- Moss
- Rocks
- Water beads
- Animal Toys (frogs, snakes, etc.)
- Scoops / cups
- Faux grass
- Acorns
- Pinecones
- Seed Pods
- Seashells
- Sand
- Craft Moss
- Faux Birds (Dollar Tree)
- Ice
- Dirt / sand
- Food coloring
- Craft foam (for lily pads)

Pirate Play Sensory Bin:



- Black beans
- Gold coins
- Gems
- Eye patches
- Glass beads
- Ring pops
- Scoops / cups
- Animal toys (spiders, rats, etc.)
- Skulls
- Spider web

Mermaid & Beach Sensory Bins:



- Craft Sand (Purple)
- Seashells (Dollar Tree)
- Glass Beads (Dollar Tree) or Water Beads
- Mermaid toys
- Tulle
- Water



Change the sand colors & glass bead colors for a beach sensory bin! Add crab & ocean toys!

Squirrel & Nuts Fall Sensory Bin:



- Wooden Tray or Wicker Basket
- Faux Grass Turf
- Faux Acorns
- Leaves
- Sticks / Twigs
- Squirrel toys or figurines
- Moss

Spider Web Science Sensory Bin:



- Container
- White yarn
- Faux spiders
- Faux spider web
- 3 Craft Sticks
- Glue
- White Acrylic Paint

Glue 3 craft sticks in a star shape and paint white. Kids can then weave the yarn around the craft sticks to create a spider web!

Super Soft Snowy Sensory Bin:



- Cotton Balls
- Snowflake and/or blue confetti or glitter
- Faux Christmas trees
- Penguin toys
- Snowmen toys
- White craft foam balls (used in slime kits)

TIP – We made our penguins and snowmen from wine corks. Paint them, add felt, googly eyes and pipe cleaners!
